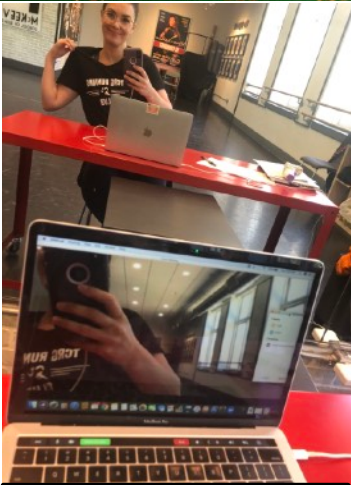
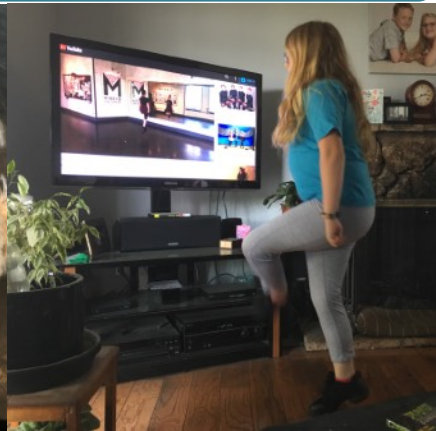

Miss McKeever set up for her zooms and wearing her TCRG Running Club Shirt! A fun Digital Club started for Irish Dance Teachers who like running!

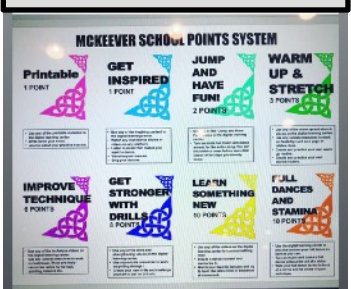

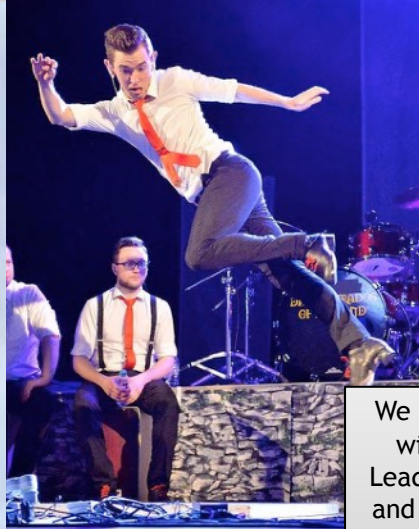

Even though we can't go to feiseanna right now, we have found a way to keep this aspect alive! Over 30 McKeever dancers competed in our first ever digital class feis in June! We had some very talented judges use the Video Feis platform to review your dancing. Jason O'Neil (Champion and Riverdance Lead), Tyler Schwartz (World Champion, lead performer, and master of heel clicks) and Dervla McGee (Riverdancer, and teacher and owner of the McGee School in Ireland where World Champion 2019 Elliot Kwele attends classes). Dancers earned special ribbons and the judges absolutely loved getting to see you dance!



We had our 2nd digital class feis in August with judges Lauren Smyth (Riverdance Lead), Maggie Darlington (Riverdance Lead and World Champion) and Kincaid Stringer (Champion and Riverdancer). 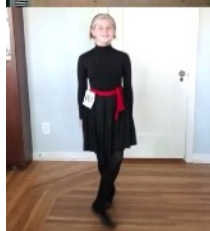
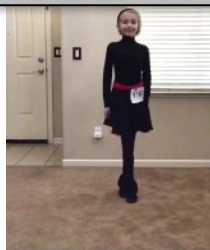

## Sacramento Magazine Interview

Steph Rodriguez interviewed artists and makers including Miss McKeever for her article "Creating in a Pandemic" in the May issue of Sacramento Magazine. Nicole spoke about how we adapted quickly to online learning platforms, and how our artform is actually perfect for small spaces and isolation because this is how it was preserved during times of oppression in Ireland!



### Nicole McKeever

The hallways of CLARA Studios for the Performing Arts were silent as dancers, musicians and actors stayed home. That silence was deafening to Nicole McKeever, owner of the McKeever School of Irish Dance, an occupant of the midtown campus.

"For Irish dance schools, March is huge," McKeever says. "We lost 25 shows. Some were really wonderful opportunities, so that was hard."

With the help of her sister, Natalie, a visual artist and videographer, McKeever posted prerecorded dance lessons and live classes online.

She says Irish dancing is an intimate art form that speaks to audiences and artists during the pandemic. "This style of dance was built for small spaces, with small groups of people," McKeever says. "It's got this quality to it that's perfect for this time of isolation. It's kind of crazy that it's perfectly made for this time."

#### DJ Larry Rodriguez

When his weekly Sunday-night dance parties at The Press Club stopped during the pandemic, DJ Larry Rodriguez decided to bring the funk to people's homes by live-streaming his Flower Bomb Dance Party on Facebook.

"I got a lot of time into setting the whole thing up and creating the sounds for it and of course the sets," he says. "People have been really appreciative of being able to dance in the confines of their comfy home. It's a good way to keep us all at a distance, but still enjoy life and keep our spirits up."

One hour and 45 minutes, Rodriguez says he looks forward to making a comeback, spinning pop, disco, electro-funk and psychedelic music to everyone moving together again.

"I'm loving the energy of the audience being there because it comes off them. Part of being a DJ is feeling that," Rodriguez says. "Then you throw out the jams accordingly. It's an instinctual thing after a while."

#### Julian Sandpaper

On a risk-free pole on K Street, there's an image of Julian Sandpaper wearing a surgical mask, surrounded by the words "Only You Can Prevent COVID-19 - Stay Home." The artist wanted to create a message about the importance of staying home and social distancing.

"I wanted to put on creative energy into something that people could see and benefit from," Sandpaper says. "The message is to stay home, wear your mask, and keep your distance. It's a simple message, but it's important. We're all in this together, and we need to look out for each other."

Under Sacramento County's stay-at-home order, Sandpaper admits to feeling isolated. Creating street art is the way of communicating with people while trying to keep the community engaged.

"I've been handing out masks, stickers and sets of temporary posters, and people are going all around the city and spreading that message," he says. "I've seen stickers in the different stores here. As an artist, it's talking to the world around me. Seeing the streets so empty is the perfect time to run around creating street art."

#### Thomas Dentrick

"At this moment, every professional musician in America is unemployed," says Thomas Dentrick, principal oboe with the Sacramento Philharmonic & Opera.

Despite cancelled concerts and postponed symphonies, Dentrick says he's more fortunate than most as he's also a professor at Sacramento State and University of the Pacific in Stockton, where he teaches double bass privately.

"I've witnessed firsthand the heartbreak of all my professional colleagues, not just in the Philippines and the Central Valley, but also the other end of the country as well as Fresno, Philadelphia, the Madison Symphony, the Fresno Community Chorus," says Dentrick, who's the president of the American Federation of Musicians Local 10 chapter.

He adds that a lot of orchestras across Northern California are hurting, but that supporters of the arts can keep music alive by donating the cost of tickets that have already been purchased.

"This cost of that ticket will go back to the organization," he says. "We'll get a tax deduction, of course. But most of all, that cash will help keep the doors open for the arts organizations. This is not for theater, for dance and for anything else. The sooner we can share our work in person, the better."

#### Gina Rossi

Sacramento artist Gina Rossi had an unusual take on the overall shutdown caused by the coronavirus. "We looked at it as a positive attitude. It's almost like a big push button that allows you to go forward and think of it really as the glass half full," she says. "We have an advantage in a way for my business and for me creating as an artist."

Rossi is known for functional sculptures made from recycled materials such as old bicycle chains, rusty bolts and abandoned musical instruments. She teaches high school students and adults the art of working inside her studio on 20th Street. With social distancing in mind, Rossi found a way to stay connected with her students through take-home art kits.

Rossi is currently working on a commissioned sculpture for the historic Marshall Hall building next to Golden 1 Center. She's creating a large trumpet made from retired musical instruments and parts such as brass pipes and marophone keys. The piece is inspired by the likes of Louis Armstrong and Billie Holiday, who once performed at the hall.

#### Saeed Storytellers

In February, Saeed Storytellers shared the stage with Grammy Award-winning reggae band Steel Pulse at the Grand Theatre. By March, all of their gigs were cancelled.

According to Saeed Storytellers drummer Matt Rodriguez, the band—now on the verge of celebrating its 20th anniversary—aims to "keep it moving."

"We're just trying to go on as business as usual and stay alive," Rodriguez says. "We're taking the time to come up with some new material. So that when, hopefully, whenever they allow us back to open again, we can share some new, new stuff."

For now, the band continues to practice and release new singles. It plans on releasing a new 7-inch and full-length album later this year.

"We'll do live shows, all the musicians and soul brothers, whether we're in a pandemic or not, we always have to make time to have fun in our jobs," Rodriguez says. "We're just staying flexible and always ready for inspiration to keep us creative."

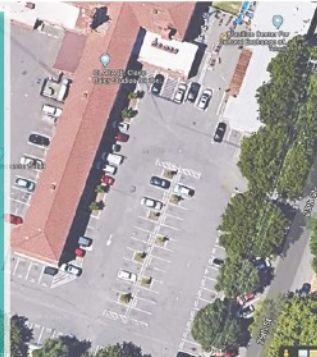

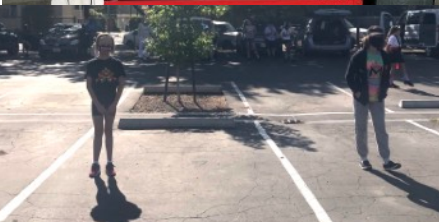

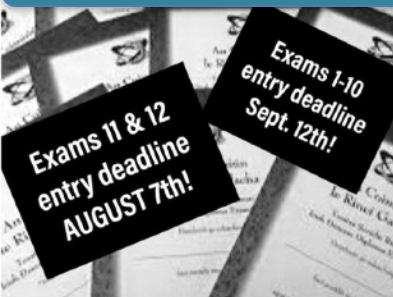


# Socially Distanced Feis-ing!

## What are Grade Exams?



Unfortunately the McKeever School Feis was cancelled. We were to host this fun event October 3rd and 4th at Hiram Johnson high school. For obvious reasons this was just not a possibility this year.

However we are still going ahead and hosting CLRG Grade Exams that same weekend at the CLARA Auditorium. Our SDCRG or Grade Examiner (The biggest type of Judge you can be!) is Vincent O'Connor from San Francisco. He will grade dancers on a series of 12 exams. If you have never heard of grade exams this is the general idea... As you move through your Irish dance career you can take these exams to prove you are proficient in specific dances and have the necessary technique required. If you wanted to become a TCRG or Irish Dance teacher you will need to have taken all 12 exams before you apply for the big TCRG test (Which is what Miss Natalie is currently about to do!). If you have never done any and are a beginner start with grades 1 and 2 or both!
